



Further Information on Local Authority feedback

Your Local Authority feedback has now been sent to you in Adobe Acrobat format (pdf). There will be a file for each year group that took part in the evaluation. Each document will contain 3 sections, each with a graph, describing scales of emotion, behaviour and school climate.

What does it mean if we don't have local authority feedback available?

The feedback report is based on the data provided by pupils in schools taking the online questionnaire. If only one school in your area participated in the evaluation you will be presented with feedback at the national level only (for reasons of school confidentiality).

Will we have access to school level feedback?

Participating schools in your local authority have been provided with feedback which compares their school to aggregated data on all participating schools in the area and also national data. This school level feedback is provided to schools only and it is up to the schools whether they choose to share this information. The national Evaluation Team will not be able to provide feedback on individual schools.

What do the *Low, Moderate and High* score categories mean?

The following implications are drawn from these scores:

For emotional and behavioural difficulties:

- Children with **high** scores are likely to have difficulties in these areas.
- Some children with **moderate** scores may have difficulties in these areas.
- Children with **low** scores are unlikely to have difficulties in these areas.

For school climate:

- Children with **high** scores are unlikely to have negative feelings about their school climate.
- Some children with **moderate** scores (between high and low) may have negative feelings about their school climate.
- Children with **low** scores are likely to have negative feelings about their school climate.
